## Western Gives Back to Communities this Holiday Season with \$100,000 for Food and Toys

Savanna Dee, Manager of the Powell River Action Center Food Bank, said the organization's frontline workers have seen a large increase in need this year.

We could not operate without donations from the public and companies, like Western Forest Products, make all the difference. Christmas is a crucial time of year as we struggle with the increased demand and we really appreciate Western Forest Products for helping us 'Feed Our Community'," said Dee.

The Cowichan Valley Basket Society (CVBS), a recipient of Western's funding, will use the funding for those that access its community soup kitchen and food bank.

Canadian food banks will typically distribute between \$5 and \$9 of food for every \$1 received in donations, over the course of a year. The CVBS is no exception and as a result, financial donations are crucial to everything we do," said Lee Smith, Board of Directors Chairperson, CVBS. "As we approach Christmas 2021, we are seeing the demand for our services steadily rising, as exacerbated by recent flooding events. We are very grateful to Western Forest Products for their generous and on-going supports."
